Want to know more about the Fiona Stanley Hospital?

The Department of Health is holding a Community Information Session this Wednesday 19 November to update interested members of the public about the State's \$1.76 billion Fiona Stanley Hospital at Murdoch.

Specialists from the Fiona Stanley Hospital Project will be available at information booths at the event to answer questions about the hospital's development. In addition, Main Roads WA, Public Transport Authority and Department for Planning and Infrastructure will be in attendance to answer queries relating to the wider planning for the Murdoch precinct.

Fiona Stanley Hospital Executive Director Brad Sebbes believes keeping the general public informed is an important part of the development process -

"Anyone who would like to learn more about the Fiona Stanley Hospital is encouraged to attend the Community Information Session."

"It's important for the local community to be kept informed of the planning and development of the site as we work together to build a first-rate hospital."

"We're keen to update the community about all areas of the project including roads, traffic planning, building design, the environment and landscape plans, and public transport," added Mr Sebbes.

The Community Information Session will be held at the Bibra Lake Community Centre on Parkway Road, Bibra Lake. Members of the public are invited to come along any time between 4.00pm and 7.00pm.

Site work is under way on the construction of the 643-bed Fiona Stanley Hospital. When complete, it will offer first class healthcare services to communities in the south metropolitan area and across the State.
