About Fiona Stanley Hospital

When it opens in 2014, Fiona Stanley Hospital at Murdoch will be Western Australia's flagship public health facility.

It will be the major public tertiary hospital in the south metropolitan area offering comprehensive health care services to communities south of Perth and across the State.

The \$2 billion Fiona Stanley Hospital, including the Australian Government contribution of \$255.7 million for the new State rehabilitation service, will rank among the best in Australia. The hospital will be a leader in clinical care, research and education, supported by an innovative design that harnesses the latest scientific, technological and medical developments.

In addition to the State rehabilitation service, Fiona Stanley Hospital will also house extensive clinical services, such as the State burns service, comprehensive cancer services, renal transplant and dialysis services, and a mental health service.

Development of Fiona Stanley Hospital

Construction of Fiona Stanley Hospital began in September 2009 and two years onwards, the project is on time and on budget for the hospital to open its doors in 2014.

The buildings that have broken out of the ground at the hospital's Murdoch site include:

- Education
- Pathology
- Main hospital
- Rehabilitation
- Central plant
- Two decked car parks
- Administration

Construction on the Mental Health Unit has just commenced and is due for completion by the end of 2012.

With the opening of Barry Marshall Parade, off Murdoch Drive, interested local residents, community members and the general public are now able to travel down the road to view the construction development of Fiona Stanley Hospital.

The map below has been developed to assist you in a self-guided tour as you travel down Barry Marshall Parade to view the progress of the hospital.

Getting there

If you are coming down from the Kwinana Freeway, exit on South Street then turn left at Murdoch Drive (at the traffic lights).

Barry Marshall Parade will be on your left (first set of traffic lights), the same entrance to St John of God Hospital.

By public transport

The Murdoch Train Station offers regular bus services (of 15 - 20 minutes frequency during peak hours and up to 30 minutes during off-peak times) down Murdoch Drive and stops from across the hospital where you will be able to cross at set traffic lights. The bus stop is marked B on the map below.

By cycling/walking

There is a shared pedestrian and cycle path down Murdoch Drive towards the hospital. You will also be able to cycle down Barry Marshall Parade to view the construction site of Fiona Stanley Hospital.

5. Pathology

The Pathology building at Fiona Stanley Hospital will provide facilities for analysis of samples on site.

6. Education

Fiona Stanley Hospital will include a dedicated education facility which will offer a comprehensive range of training programs to students and staff across all health disciplines. The four-floor building will be located next to the main hospital and linked via a walkway. The Education building will include, among other things: three lecture theatres, a clinical skills training centre and resource and information centre.

8. Main hospital

The main hospital will house a full range of acute medical and surgical services, state-of-the-art emergency care which will support a major trauma centre, comprehensive cancer services, renal transplantation and dialysis services, obstetrics and child and adolescent services. The design of the hospital is based on principles of environmental sustainability, good accessibility and a healing health care environment.

9. Rehabilitation

Note: The \$2 billion Fiona Stanley Hospital includes the Australian Government contribution of \$255.7 million for the new State rehabilitation service. The 140-bed State rehabilitation service will treat people with spinal cord injuries, acquired brain injuries, and requirements for rehabilitative care after strokes, neurological disease and amputations.

10. Mental Health Unit

Fiona Stanley Hospital will include a 30-bed purpose-built mental health facility and will include an eight-bed mother and baby unit and a secure area.

11. Central Plant

Central Plant will be the powerhouse of Fiona Stanley hospital, providing water, gas, heating and cooling, and electricity to all of the hospital's buildings and surrounding grounds. Commissioning of the plant will occur in 2012.

12 and 13. Decked car park

Fiona Stanley Hospital will offer 3,600 basement, ground level and multi-storey car parking bays on site. Accessible walkways will be available from the decked car parks to the main hospital and State rehabilitation service.
