

# Delivering first-class health services

When it opens in 2014, the Fiona Stanley Hospital at Murdoch will be Western Australia's flagship health facility. It will be the major tertiary hospital in the south metropolitan area and will offer comprehensive health care services to communities south of Perth and across the State.

The \$1.76 billion tertiary hospital will rank among the best in Australia – a leader in clinical care, research and education, supported by an innovative design that harnesses the latest scientific, technological and medical developments.

The 643-bed hospital will include:

- a full range of acute medical and surgical services;
- the State burns service;
- a major trauma centre including a 24-hour emergency department;
- WA's first comprehensive cancer centre south of the river including radiotherapy treatment facilities, medical oncology and haematology;
- renal dialysis and transplantation;
- obstetrics and neonatology services;
- paediatric services;
- cardiothoracic services;
- a mental health unit with a secure wing, and including a mother and baby unit;
- imaging and radiology services including MRI, CT and PET/CT scanning;



- comprehensive pathology and cell tissue manufacturing facilities;
- extensive ambulatory care services including comprehensive outpatient and allied health services; and
- a state-of-the-art medical research facility to be built in conjunction with universities and the Western Australian Institute for Medical Research.

The new State rehabilitation service will also be located on the Fiona Stanley Hospital site.

Fiona Stanley Hospital will be the new home of the adult **State burns service**. Patients with the most severe cases of burns and other conditions resulting in skin loss will be treated by the State's internationally renowned specialist burns team. The state-of-the-art service will include 10 beds and research facilities and will offer comprehensive burns services to patients from across the State.

Fiona Stanley Hospital's **Cancer Centre** will include radiotherapy, haematology and oncology facilities, a day therapy unit including chemotherapy services, and a dedicated Breast Service. Developed around its own private courtyard, the Centre will provide a discreet and considerate setting for patients including a separate entrance and drop-off area.

Fiona Stanley Hospital will also provide an **Emergency Department** with 70 beds/treatment areas. It will include a dedicated drop-off area, paediatric and adult short-stay zones and trauma, resuscitation and treatment areas.

Located at the centre of an **integrated health, education and research precinct** at Murdoch, Fiona Stanley Hospital is also set to benefit from excellent links to St John of God Hospital Murdoch, local education providers, and a state-of-the-art on-site medical research facility to be built by the Western Australian Institute for Medical Research.

Fiona Stanley Hospital will also provide for a range of clinical areas including:

- sleep centre;
- intensive care unit;
- coronary care unit;
- aged care;
- pharmacy;
- mortuary;
- hyperbaric medicine; and
- an interventional operative and procedural care unit.
