


## How to care for an intravenous cannula-drip while in hospital

## How to keep the drip dry:

- ask the nurse to wrap the drip before a shower
- try not to touch the drip or pull the tube
- tell the nurse if the dressing is wet

## The drip should be removed before leaving the hospital.

If the old drip site hurts or if your child feels cold, hot or shaky after you go home, make sure you take your child to the doctor as soon as possible. These symptoms are important as they can lead to sepsis (blood poisoning) and they can get very sick.



A new drip will be inserted if it is still needed.
